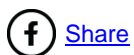

This airport hotel is 1.5 km from Soekarno-Hatta International Airport and 13 km from Benteng Heritage Museum.

Subdued rooms with wood floors and floor-to-ceiling windows offer free Wi-Fi and 32-inch flat-screen TVs, plus desks, mini fridges, and tea and coffee making facilities. Upgraded rooms add balconies with lake views or private garden terraces. Suites add soaking tubs and

separate living rooms with sofas, while upgraded suites add kitchenettes.

The average maximum daytime temperature in Jakarta in August is 33°C (91°F) with very high humidity. There is generally 9 hours of bright sunshine daily.

Expect 77mm (3.0 inches) of rainfall in the month of August, 8 days with some rain falling.
